

Young team hopes to grow quickly

Coming off a 14-9 season, the Bulldogs will rely on a heavy mix of youth to meet their goals and to match the sucess they enjoyed last season.

"This is the youngest team I've had in my coaching career," noted Head Coach Kyle Menke. "We have 30 boys in our program, and 23 are either sophomores or freshmen.'

Not to say that the cupboard of experience is totally bare, as the Bulldogs will return six letterwinners from last year in: Trevor Hanna, Grant Fjelstad, Anthony Naser, Tommy Kaktis, Chett Helming, and Colby Groe. Menke noted that thus far, the experienced players have been setting the right tone in practice.

"Our seniors have done a great job of leading by example in the early-season practices," he noted. In particular, Menke pointed to a trio of experienced players to form the nucleus of his leadership circle and on-court production. "Trevor Hanna is our most experienced player, and we're looking forward to seeing what he can accomplish as a senior point guard," Menke noted. "We're also expecting increased

He added, that with so many inexperienced players, "The key to this season will be finding the right combination of players who can play with consistency on both ends of the court." He added. "We have good overall team quickness and some young, skilled post players. I am hoping this will be a team that makes great improvement throughout the course of the season."

"Last year's squad took Lake Mills wrestling to a level it hasn't seen in nearly two decades," said Coach Alex Brandenburg. "We finally have gotten to the point where we feel like we can compete with the best teams in Qualifying for state duals for the third straight year will be one of the

main goals, but placing third or higher will be the main goal. Most of the starting line-up returns from last year, but placing in the top three again will be tough task. Class 1A has the strongest core of top five dual teams it has seen in years. "If we can stay healthy and get our kids spread out to certain weights, I think we could have an even stronger dual line-up than last year," Brandenburg said, "The difficult part about getting third or better will be that Lisbon, Don Bosco, Denver, and Missouri Valley return almost

"Although our main goal was a top three finish in the state duals, it was exciting to accomplish our other team goal of winning the TIC tourney." noted Brandenburg. "Winning the conference tournament got the momentum going and helped us the next two weeks to win Sectionals and

As for the schedule, the majority of the Bulldogs toughest meets will be before break. They attend the Battle of Waterloo, square off against some north central Iowa powers, and have the annual battles with Blue Earth

Area and Maple River. The record may have a few dings come break time, but the experience gained from the tough competition should pay dividends come postseason time.

As previously mentioned, Lake Mills returns most of its starting line-up. A quartet of Bulldog state place winners will lead the charge. Senior, Gabe Irons (52-8) placed eight. Juniors, Caiden Jones (52-5) and Cael Boehmer (37-15) placed fifth and eighth, respectively. Tyler Helgeson (48-12) got eighth as a freshman. The senior class has plenty more to offer as Cole Bergo (37-17), Alex Martinson (34-18), Brett Tyler (7-5), Drae Love (16-16 in '16). and Alex Albert (15-22) all have multiple varsity letters. The junior class supplies district qualifier Kyle Beery (35-19) and Max Johnson (26-16) to go along with its two place-winners. The final two returning letterwinners are sophomores, Ashten Love (27-19) and Drake Harnish (13-5). Besides the letterwinners, the Bulldogs have numerous returnees, who were dominant in junior varsity matches. Lake Mills also sports one of the strongest freshmen classes it has ever had.

The coaching staff will be similar to last year. Alex Brandenburg, Mike Piper, Jamie Ham, and Brad Helgeson return to help guide the Bulldog wrestlers. "I am excited to have these three guys to help lead this team," Brandenburg said. "They know what it takes for kids to be great wrestlers and teammates, and they do a great job teaching these skills.'
